Examples of Hopes and Fears

Types of Hope

- 1. Innate hope Hope from childhood
- 2. Forced hope Hope that is expected by others
- 3. Borrowed hope Hope to share with others in society
 - 4. False hope Hope that will not become true
- 5. If-this-then-maybe hope Hope that might come true through dedication

Types of Fear

- 1. Physiological fear Fear of physical harm
- 2. Safety Fear Fear that makes you feel insecure
- 3. Ego death/esteem fear Fear that causes a lack of confidence
- 4. Belonging Fear Fear that makes you feel lonely / alienated
- 5. Loss of Autonomy
 Fear that causes a loss of your sense of being /
 cannot be resolved by yourself
